Reporting Crimes & Other Emergencies

San Bernardino Community College encourages all Students and Staff to immediately report all crimes, serious incidents or other emergencies to the San Bernardino Community College District Police Dept. by dialing 4491 (on-campus) or (909) 384-4491, 24 hours a day.

Be aware that on graveyard and weekends the San Bernardino County Sherriff's Department dispatches (will answer your call and send police to assist you) for the San Bernardino Community College District Police Dept. The San Bernardino Community College District Police Dept office is open for business Monday thru Friday 8:00am – 5:00pm (except for holiday breaks). During normal business hours, San Bernardino Community College District Police may be contacted in the Campus Center Room 100 or by calling ext. 4491. In the event of an emergency, students and staff are requested to make a prompt and accurate report to the San Bernardino Community College District Police Dept.

Students are also encouraged to report any problems with the campus environment to the San Bernardino Community College District Police Department, but we encourage reporting anywhere on campus you feel comfortable, such as the following administrators: President, Vice President Admin Services, Vice President Student Services, Vice President Instruction, Director of Student Life, Dean of Counseling, Dean of Instruction, Athletics, CDC Director, Health Center, Coordinator. Institutional personnel will assist the student in notifying authorities if the student requests assistance.

The San Bernardino Community College District Police Dept, Counseling, Student Health Services and Student Life will accept confidential and anonymous reports of crimes for inclusion in the annual statistical report. It is our goal to provide assistance wherever the report is made to make sure we include the crime in our annual security report. San Bernardino Valley College also encourages anyone who witnesses or has knowledge of a crime, or if you have seen or know of someone who has committed a crime, is dealing drugs, or has defaced San Bernardino Valley College property, to report the information to WeTIP (<http://www.wetip.com>) by calling 800-78-CRIME. Reports are taken 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and are completely anonymous.

Dear SBVC students/staff/faculty,

On Wednesday night at approximately 9:20 p.m., an SBVC student waiting for the bus behind the bus stop on Mt. Vernon Avenue was approached by two individuals—one of which stole a gold necklace from around her neck. The two suspects fled on foot and proceeded into an unknown, black 4-door sedan and drove northbound on Mt. Vernon Avenue. The suspects are still at large and were described as two Hispanic males in their 20's.

The Colton Police Department and San Bernardino Police Department have been notified. In addition, SBCCD Police have notified Omni-trans of the incident in order to raise the awareness level of their staff and riders. If you or somebody you know may have witnessed the incident or have further information, please contact SBCCD Police at 909.384.4491.

As a result of the incident, additional security has been added to the Mt. Vernon Avenue corridor during the evening hours. Students, staff and faculty should take the following extra precautions:

Refrain from standing alone in darkened areas and remember to utilize the pathways and waiting locations that are well lit during evening hours.

Do not bring significant valuables to campus if possible. Any valuables brought on campus should not be exposed if at all possible.

Always be aware of your surroundings—especially during the evening hours. This includes knowing who may be in your general vicinity and not being distracted by using your cell phone or iPod
